The conference organizers welcome all of those with an interest in the economics of fishery management, seafood trade, and aquaculture, to join us for the fifteenth international Biennial Conference of IIFET to be held in beautiful Montpellier, France, July 13-16, 2010.

The Organizing Institutions

IIFET is the only global professional organization devoted to improving understanding of all aspects of fisheries and aquaculture economics and seafood trade. Members include academics, fisheries managers and policy makers, seafood industry members, international organizations and national government representatives.

IIFET 2010 Montpellier will be held at "Le Corum" congress center in Montpellier, France.

Montpellier is the regional capital of Languedoc-Roussillon in the south of France. Located just a few kilometers from the Mediterranean coast, it is home to many of France's most important research institutes which focus on marine and aquaculture related research. Several significant Universities and Research Institutes are located in Montpellier.

Institut de Recherche pour le Développement/Institute of Research for Development (IRD), Institut Français de Recherche pour l'Exploitation de la Mer/French Research Institute for Exploitation of the Sea (Ifremer), and the University of Montpellier collaborate to form the Center for Research on Mediterranean and Tropical Fisheries (CRH), located in Sète, a fishing port near Montpellier.

IRD performs research and manages scientific programmes centred on the relations between man and his environment in the tropics.

✓ Conference Themes and Topics

The general theme and title of the IIFET 2010 Montpellier conference is:

"Economics of fish resources and aquatic ecosystems: balancing uses, balancing costs"

This theme will deal with the multi-functionality of fisheries and aquatic ecosystems, with particular emphasis on the developing world. The following topics will be of particular interest:

- The contributions of capture fisheries and aquaculture to socioeconomic wellbeing: sustainable economic growth, food security and income
- Fisheries economics and global changes (globalization, climate change, economic crises)
- Aquaculture economics
- Markets and marketing of fish products
- The economics of fisheries management (with special emphasis on small scale fisheries), including regulation and allocation systems, enforcement costs, ecosystem based fisheries management, managing the transition to sustainable and responsible fisheries
- Acknowledging the full costs of fish production
- Fisheries in the context of integrated coastal zone management (ICZM)
- Risk and uncertainty in fisheries
- Models and indicators

✓ **Policy Day**

A "Policy Day" event will be held in conjunction with the conference. This year, Policy Day will be organized as a one-day post conference seminar, and will be held on Saturday, July 17th, in a location to be determined in or near Montpellier.

The day-long event will be sponsored by the European Commission's General Directorate for Maritime Affairs and Fisheries. The focus will be on fishery management issues in a reformed European Union Common Fisheries Policy (EU CFP), including policy regionalization, rights based management and subsidies. Given the geographical location of the event, special attention will also be dedicated to the Mediterranean region. Practical experiences with policy reform and innovative management approaches from other parts of the world will feed into the debate.

Your conference registration fee will include participation in this post-conference event at no extra charge, and free transportation will be provided to the Policy Day location.

✓ **Call for Abstracts**

IIFET and IRD invite you to submit **250 word** (maximum) abstracts for papers and/or posters for presentation at IIFET 2010. Abstracts should be submitted online via the conference website (<http://www.colloque.ird.fr/iifet-2010/> click on "Abstract submission" for details). The deadline for submission of abstracts is **January 20, 2010**, with acceptance decisions sent by **February 20, 2010**.

Abstracts may refer to one of the topics listed above.

✓ **Conference Features**

- Four days of plenary, submitted, and invited paper sessions
- Formal and informal social events including a welcome reception and conference banquet
- Alternative formats such as panel, roundtable and debate-style presentations
- Poster Sessions
- Space for publishers, consulting firms and others to display goods and services
- Prizes for best papers

✓ Posters

Poster sessions will be available for presenters to share their research at IIFET 2010 Montpellier. Presenters are strongly encouraged to seriously consider this format, which is very suitable for presentations aimed at sharing information and knowledge which is highly descriptive, presenting general trends in graphs, or describing a program, where the presentation does not contain a great deal of complex economic analysis. Presenters who are not comfortable communicating in English to a large group should also consider poster format. The Scientific Committee may elect to re-allocate an abstract from oral to poster format, or vice versa, where appropriate, to balance and optimize the program.

A specific room will be available to exhibit the paper posters. The recommended paper poster format is A0.

✓ Awards and Prizes

✓ IIFET Best Student Paper Award

The IIFET Executive Committee is once again pleased to offer an award of \$500 US to the author of the best student paper presented at IIFET 2010 France. Any student currently enrolled, or within one year post- graduation from a graduate program is eligible to apply. A travel stipend of up to \$2000 will be offered to the winner. This prize is sponsored by US NOAA Fisheries. (*Submit full paper by March 20, 2010.*)

✓ Developing Country Aquaculture Economics Best Student Paper

With support from the AquaFish Collaborative Research Support Program (AquaFish CRSP) IIFET offers a prize of **\$500** for the best student paper on an aquaculture topic *related to the developing world*. Students from any country are eligible to apply, but the topic must be relevant to developing countries. Partial travel support of up to **\$2,000** and free conference registration will also be provided to the winner. (*Submit full paper by March 20, 2010.*)

✓ Aquaculture Economics Professional Travel Awards

In addition, AquaFish CRSP and IIFET offer two additional partial travel grants for aquaculture economics professionals (ie. not students). Up to **\$1500** each, plus free conference registration, will be provided. (*Applicants for this award must have an abstract accepted in the "Early Bird" scientific review, and must submit an extended abstract by January 20, 2010.*)

✓ JIFRS Yamamoto Prizes

Any participant in an IIFET biennial conference from a developing country presenting a paper encouraging the rational development of responsible national fisheries in his or her own country is eligible to apply for a Japan International Fisheries Research Society (JIFRS) Yamamoto Prize. Up to two prizes of \$500 each will be offered; JIFRS will assist the winners of the JIFRS Yamamoto Prize with an additional US\$ 1,000 each to partially cover travel costs. The payment will be made together with the JIFRS Yamamoto Prize at the IIFET conference in France. (*Submit full paper by March 20, 2010.*)

✓ OECD Prize for Best Policy Paper

The Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) will offer a prize of \$500 for the paper that most successfully addresses a contemporary fisheries policy issue, based on strong economic analysis and providing sound advice to policymakers. Eligible papers may address issues in either OECD or non-OECD countries and can cover any aspect of fisheries policy. (*Submit full paper by March 20, 2010.*)
